Super indent's Report By Phil Edholm June, 2021 Divisional Update

Superintendents Report

There are two topics that are top of mind for me these days, the 2021 NMRA national convention Rails By The Bay and how the Coast division returns to physical events later this year or early 2022.

2021 NMRA Convention Rails By The Bay

Have you registered for the national convention yet? If not, please consider that this is a great opportunity. The convention has gone virtual and offers a great opportunity to attend a national convention. Also, as the convention is representing the PCR, it is a great event for all of us. These are great reasons to attend.

The Modeling

RBTB 2021 will feature a global array of clinicians. With over 70 clinics in total, there will be an amazing amount of information. And, as it is virtual, all clinics will be viewable after they are presented and for up to two weeks. One key advantage of the virtual convention is the interaction with the clinicians. Each clinic will be followed by an extended meeting with the clinician in the "The Clinic Goes On" virtual room. This will allow extended conversation and discussions.

RBRT 2021 is spotlighting 30 model railroad layouts, many from the western US, but also some from around the globe. While we will not be visiting these railroads physically, we will get a virtual experience like no other. Each railroad will be featured before and during the event in high quality videos that will let you experience the modeling and overview of each layout. Then, during the convention, each layout owner will have live discussions about their layout. These will enable deep discussions about what modelers are doing and how.

As in any live event, the discussions with clinicians and the layout owners are being done in spaces that do not lend themselves to recording, so this part of the program will only be available to attendees of the actual events.

It is the BIG NMRA Gathering

The NMRA national convention is the biggest gathering for model railroaders. It will be no different this year. As always, the best modelers that can come will come, and this year it is easier than ever to attend, so everyone will be there. At the convention we will have two simultaneous clinic tracks along with a large gathering Great Hall (in Zoom). From that hall, there will be a range of breakout rooms available all through the convention. In addition to the clinic discussion rooms, there will be focuses such as Op and LDSig, narrow gauge, N and Z scales, Cool Tools, Modular Modeling, Small Layouts, and many more.

This, along with other social tools will make connecting with old friends and making new ones based on your hobby interests easy.

It is the best value of 2021

This will be the only time, probably in history, you will be able to attend a complete NMRA National Convention for only \$50. For that you get not only the best new model railroad information and techniques, but you also get to see and discuss some of the leading layouts in the world. And throughout you will be able to make new friends and long-term relationships as you only can in a social environment.

Normally it would cost at least \$500 to attend a local convention. If you are traveling and staying in the convention hotel, a typical convention will cost \$2,500-\$2,500. You have 5 or 6 nights of hotel, airfare, parking, cars, etc. And, of course the hassle and time away from work and family. Now, we all have a once in a lifetime opportunity to attend and meet and talk to the large NMRA community.

- Clinic Goes On Moderator moderate the meeting (keep the chat on topic, promote discussion on the topic, encourage questions for clinician, ensure all attendees get to ask questions), share needed links with attendees, notify attendees when

Information Desk Operator Assistant - assist the Information Desk Operator. Sign up HERE.

Breakout Room Moderator - Circulate among the breakout rooms assisting attendees. Promote discussion among attendees, introduce people in breakout rooms, be welcoming, helpful and promote social interaction among attendees. Sign up HERE.

- ⇒ Model Railroader magazine provided two movies: "Fun with Model Trains,"
 and "Along the Right-of-Way"
- \Rightarrow A business meeting was followed by an auction, which sold just under 500 items for a total of \$1300, netting the division \$130.
- ⇒ The raffle was for a choice of a UP 2-10-2 or a Nevada County Narrow Gauge 2-8-0
- \Rightarrow Contest category were kit structures. The previous contest had 334 entries
