First of all I want to wish everyone Happy Holidays from the Coast Division. Our next meet is, March 23, 2014 at:

It will start at 9:30 AM. There will be two clinics and a roundtable. I really want to encourage entries into the contest so there will be an extra door prize again for every entry in model or photo even if it is just show and tell. At this time the clinics are Build a Memory – doing the framework and foam sub-roadbed – beginners but there will be enough for even master modelers in this – given by Mike Blumensaadt and myself, then Eric Moe will be a continuation on the Timesaver – he will be showing an On3 Timesaver that uses stub switches. It will be worth going just to see that in action!

The roundtable will be led by Howard again and the kick off topic will be on Dead Rail with a demo of it installed in an On3 engine.

Again I am going to show some video's after the business meeting. I am open as to what to show but plan on doing movies from the Kalmback series "Dream, Plan, Build". These are excellent movies and the ones I will show will be mainly on modeling.

Again the auction made a sizeable amount due to the large estate. We had over 600 items and had to close taking items. We will be having more estate items at the next auction from other estates. The auction is very important as it is the main method of raising money for our division. This has allowed us to not have to charge admission as many other divisions charge per meet. We had two clinics and the room was packed for both of them. We also had over 100 people sign in. This was about double the number that we had for the previous meet.

## Working On A Model Railroad in Oklahoma -part III By Tom Vanden Bosch

For this installment I'm a little short of words but I thought photos to illustrate what I've outlined in the first two installments might be of interest. The first photo on the right illustrates the construction of the layout room inside the "barn". The photo looks West. The horizontal beam in the background is the base of the mushroom at Stillwell. The ladder and toolbox are in what will be the U-shaped peninsula with Spiro on the toolbox side and Sallisaw on the ladder side. The Arkansas River crossing will be between the two where the tape on the floor shows where the "U" will connect the two walls.

The horizontal beams will support a new ceiling for the layout room with the associated electrical and air conditioning equipment/piping.





The next photo shows construction of the layout in the area under the mushroom. The track bed in the foreground is for the Missouri Pacific that will cross the KCS in Sallisaw, to the right of the photo. The KCS mainline from Sallisaw North will pass along the backdrop. In between the two, the site of Crown Zellerbach creosoting plant is being prepared.

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The next photo shows the South side of the layout room under construction. The offwhite wall on the left is the dividing wall between the layout room and the workshop/ lounge/office/dispatching area. The wall under construction on the left of the photo will be the dividing wall between Marble City on the right and St. Clair Lime on the left. The mainline and branch to the lime plant will circle around the end of the wall under construction. The mainline will be climbing and will be at about chest level at the curve and will be well above the lime plant on its way to the mushroom and Stilwell. The corner of the worktable in the lower left is about at the future location of Heavener yard.





The construction is well advanced in this photo of the location of the town of Poteau. The photo is taken from the future location of the North (railroad) end of Heavener yard. The structure on the right is the support for the end of the mushroom; Westville and Watts will be located along the aisle wall. This photo illustrates the complete enclosure of

the peninsula dividing wall with facia and or backdrop. The narrow facia above the layout fronts a shelf under which are the lights. As you can see from the photo the shelf becomes a convenient storage place and continues to be that way to this date.

Well that's all for this time. Hopefully my photo scanning will improve and I can show you some photos of the layout as it exists today in the next installment.

## InfoNet-News For January, 2014 By Tom Draper

#### eBay GivingWorks Program

The NMRA participates in eBay's GivingWorks program. GivingWorks allows eBay users to donate a portion of winning auction prices to their favorite charity. Here is how it works. When you are selling any item on eBay, simply specify the 'National Model Railroad Association' as your chosen charity. Set a percentage of the final selling price to donate and let eBay do its work. If your item sells, the percentage you pre-select goes to the NMRA, and you keep the balance. An additional benefit to the seller is that eBay will reduce your final listing fees by the same percentage. If you donate 25% of the final auction price to the NMRA and your item was \$100, the NMRA receives \$25, you receive \$75 and your final listing fees from eBay are reduced by 25%.

Does it have to be train related items for sale? No, past winning auctions have included cell phones, iPhones, toner, calendars, manuals, and of course trains.

You can even donate directly from the NMRA GivingWorks page.

So now, if you are changing eras, selling unused rolling stock or upgrading your latest smartphone, sell it on eBay and specify the NMRA as your favorite charity.

Simply start by visiting <u>http://givingworks.ebay.com</u>, enter 'National Model Railroad Association' in the search box in the upper left corner and the rest is easy.
