There will be three categories :

The Show and Tell table will be open for all. Bring your work-in-progress. Let us see what's coming down the line.

In the process, you'll give us a way to get to know you and your modeling better. You'll meet other members who could be helpful and be friendly resources, sources of ideas, expertise, or just plain friendly helping hands. You'll provide inspiration to us all. You'll help prospective members see what NMRA membership is all about. And you'll make the camera shutterbugs go crazy.

In a nutshell, inspire yourself to finish that project that you've been meaning to get to! Bring something to share that you've completed some time ago but never entered. Show off a little (smile!) You'll be glad you did. And we all love it.

Available: NMRA Model Judging for Merit Points or Contest Prep

At your optional choice, we will have available for you NMRA model judging for any models that you enter into Model Contest, or bring For Show Only.

The results will be private, and there will be *no effect* on the Popular Vote results.

You can find out how you would have done from our qualified panel of Coast Division judges, who will focus on helping you with positive, friendly ideas for further improving your model.

If you are preparing an entry for Regional/National convention Model Contest, this is a superb way to refine and prepare.

Remember too that any model that you are proud of, you may bring it and have it privately judged for a Merit Award (Merit Awards count towards Master Model Railroader (MMR). Take advantage of a low-effort way to see how close your prize model is. Even if you know that your particular model may not quite just yet be MMR level, it's be fun to learn (and gain help and resources) on what you would need to do to get that model to that level.

In closing:

There is a lively ongoing discussion as the best path that NMRA Model Contest, both at our Coast Division level, as well as the Region/National level, should take as it evolves in the future. I'd love to hear your comments.


