At the October Board of Director's meeting in Sparks, we had the opportunity to preview the convention site. You will really enjoy these facilities as well as the activities planned for the convention. No Coast Division member should fail to see the Golden Gate Express exhibit at the Conservatory of Flowers in Golden Gate Park in San Francisco. The garden railroad folks have done one outstanding job putting together this exhibit, and it will be open through April 18 this year. There is a cable car climbing the hill, automobiles actually move across the Golden Gate Bridge, a train or two running through the entire scene and many recognizable structures built from unlikely materials. Those familiar with San Francisco will recognize most of the buildings, but the challenge is to decipher what was used to construct them. And, if you are there at the right time, the fog will actually roll in under the bridge! The conservatory has a very interesting collection of vegetation too, so spend an hour or so seeing the whole display. I went on public transit, and the 5, 21 and 33 MUNI bus lines all run close by.

Another worthwhile trip in Coast Division is the new Disney Family Museum at the Presidio of San Francisco. Lots of FREE parking there, something rarely found in The City. This is not about Disneyland, but the life of Walt Disney and has a smattering of railroad interest. Walt was a great modeler and his own live steam train is exhibited there, along with some home movies of it in action. They said to allow an hour, but it took me three, and I doubt I saw it all. This one isn't closing in April, so you can schedule a visit at your leisure. But, it is very interesting if you have any interest in animation, or are just curious how they do those things.

Don't forget the March Coast Layout Tours put together by Dave Parks and his crew. One of the best values of being an NMRA member is the chance to invade someone's home and see their layout. I always come away with several ideas for improvements to mine and new techniques I never thought of to reach some goal. We have great layouts here in this Division and you owe it to yourself to see them. There is information about them in the Branch Line recently delivered to you. And, while you have that copy in your hands, why not exercise your right and vote in the election. The ballot is in the magazine. Auction at the December meet:

Once again, the Auction Committee was faced with the daunting challenge of limited space and a large number of items presented for auction by our membership.

We had 338 items in the live auction with an additional 25 estate items at the end for a total of 363 items.

There were 21 items in the silent auction as well.

The March auction is already proving to be larger.

There will be at least 50 lots in the silent auction and a large number of estate items in the regular auction. These items were donated to the Coast Division and the proceeds go to our operations.

Silver Rails 2010 PCR Convention By Jim Long

The 2010 PCR Convention Silver Rails will be April 28 – May 2 at the Nugget Hotel in Sparks, NV.

On Thursday we will have the Donner Summit and Tunnel Tour. There is no cost for this tour. On Friday the group will be going to the Western Pacific Railroad Museum in Portola. The admission is free

On Saturday we will tour the Nevada State Railroad Museum in Carson City, the small railroad in Mills Park and take a round trip ride on newly expanded V&T RR. This tour cost \$60 and includes a lunch.

All tours will be self guided and we will be setting up car pools for those that don't have a car.

There is a form on the tours page were you can sign up to help drive a car pool.

We have set the menu for the Saturday Night Banquet. The cost of this is included with registration.

The PCR Breakfast will be on Sunday morning and is included. Please tell us if you plan on attending as we have give them this count as well. The Hobo Breakfast will be Saturday Morning in Rosie's Café in the Nugget. We will have a separate area. We will be ordering off the menu and each of us paying for what we order. The food is reasonable and good. I will most likely eat there several times during the convention. We will have a signup sheet at registration in Registration so we know how many will be attending.

For the first time we are offering a series of Modeling With The Masters clinics. There is a limit of 15 people in each clinic. These are all make and take clinics where you get to build a project under the direction of a MMR and then take it home. The clinics are Scratch Building a Styrene Structure, Building a DPM Kit, Building a Laser Structure Kit and Building a Turnout Using a Commercial Fixture. These clinics cost between \$28 and \$50. They will be taught by Clark Kooning MMR from Canada. Please sign up for

these so we have enough people to put on the program.

There will be a full slate of regular clinics that have no cost. A preliminary list is on the website. It looks like we will have 12 layouts open for tours during the convention and a couple for driving back home on Sunday.

There will several operating sessions at local layouts.

Fremont Train Club Seeking New Members

The Tri-City Society of Model Engineers (TCSME), a Fremont, California based model railroad club is seeking new members to help build the club's new N-scale and HO-scale model railroads. Effective February 2010, the TSCME will be moving back into the newly restored former Southern Pacific Niles Passenger Station and Freight House, now located near their former original locations alongside the Union Pacific railroad tracks. The N-scale train layout will again be housed inside the Niles Passenger Station, while the HO-scale train layout will be housed in the newly rebuilt Freight House.

Our HO-scale model railroad has been designed by Byron Henderson. It will represent the Southern Pacific from SP's San Jose passenger station to Niles Jct., then through Niles Canyon and points east. The Western Pacific line through Niles Jct., Niles Canyon and points east will also be modeled.

The N-scale layout will model the Southern Pacific and Western Pacific from the Warm Springs Yard in Fremont north to Oakland, plus, both railroads' lines through Niles Canyon to points east.

I'm not sure when I began writing and distributing those hundreds of flyers for Coast Division meets but I'm certain fliers don't get many to attend a meet. What brings 'new' people to our meets is when a Coast member explains how meetings increase their hobby enjoyment and hands them a flier or our web URL to remind them when/where our next meet is. Our best Coast Publicity depends more on what YOU do and say

than what only I write or do. Try inviting someone to our next Coast meet; if they come, most, maybe all will benefit from their new ideas and fresh energy.

Lately, Live Steamers have been urging "Every One Teach One": urging us all to 'mentor' at least 1 person, to teach anyone interested Basic Steam Safety, to ensure Safe Live Steam fun and help our Live Steam community to grow and prosper, so we all continue to enjoy future Live Steam safely.

Although most of us model alone (like any models for AP), I/we find enjoying Model Railroading most fully includes many group activities. Unless we want to build everything (from scratch), we need others to attract and retain a 'critical mass' of manufacturers and suppliers of track, models, kits, scenery, etc, indeed, for ALL the stuff we need to build and run model railroads in any scale. It's our combined purchases which encourage new products to be developed and marketed for us, books and hobby magazines written & published, all the rest. If we want new model stuff to continue growing our train fun (and, lightening our wallet?), we all need "Every"

One to Teach at least One".

I strongly encourage you, as my Mom taught me as a kid by her actions, to Talk to Strangers. Mom showed me waiting in line can be fun if you talk with others. Even better, do this at a train store or other train venue: ask if they want to enjoy trains more? Talking with strangers is easier the more you try. To learn and practice easily, volunteer for the PCR Membership table at a train show. It's easy & fun; I guarantee 99.9% of people there enjoy talking trains! I mostly say "we're not selling anything, just here to answer questions, explain the Timesaver, give you a free magazine" and a meeting flyer if they live locally. Some just want to sit a few minutes to rest: that's fine. Our hobby fun grows when someone joins us to enjoy trains, whatever that means to them.

Coast meets are opportunities to meet, connect and share with others who enjoy trains. We learn new ways to enjoy trains from each other: Railfanning, Operations, Modeling, Scenery, Photography are ways we enjoy trains; not just in clinics, but talking and sharing 'new' ideas elsewhere.

Although I assume someone else mentioned this elsewhere in the Dispatcher, Coast Division is looking for new sites to have quarterly meetings. The Computer History Museum is unavailable because of remodeling. Thanks to Don Shortt's continuing relationship with Buchser School, our March 7th Coast meeting WILL again be there. Similarly, Jim Manley's Volunteering with CHM enabled Coast Division meets there when Jim Long's relationship with Fremont School for the Deaf ended when Jim retired. One commonality to Coast Meeting sites has been a trusted relationship between one Coast member and a non-profit org's Management and Facilities personnel; this allowed them and Coast through them to access/use their site for less than normal cost. Coast Meets also were at churches (on Saturdays), clubs and other sites: where Coast members had contacts.





On the web site, look for the link: " View Visitor Statistics ".


The E-Dispatcher has a picture of what you can see.
