Unofficial Former **DIRECTORS REPORT** By John Houlihan

My last official action as your Daylight Division Director occurred at the Santa Barbara meet where I had the pleasure of presenting the Daylight Division's "Member of the Year" award to Gary Siegel.

The meet seemed crowded, yet the attendance was down from last year. It was crowded because the rain pushed us under the patio cover. I

think this condition caused a few anxious individuals to overbid on items in the White Elephant event.

After the meet, some members ignored the wet conditions and ran on the battery operated G Scale layout, while the more sane people operated the HO layout. I chose to watch the CTC operator rather than run one of the trains.

Having observed the operation of the ATSF's CTC panel in Fresno, I was interested in how Gary's board would work. From its outward appearance, all the right switches and buttons are on the board. Throwing turnouts and clearing switches was done in a prototypically manner. The board did not have the paper printout of the time each train cleared an OS section. To compensate for this shortcoming, the operator wrote the number of each lead locomotive on a piece of tape and placed it next to the train's approximate location, advancing the tape as the train moved down the track. Also miss-

ing was the electronics to make the local control of turnouts a functioning feature of the board. I was told that the person responsible for the wiring moved out of the area. I wonder if there is an interested student at UCBS that could tackle the project.

- Take the Airport/Kings Canyon exit, Exit 128A, onto CA-180 East. Drive 3.9 miles. (NOTE: This may be a construction zone.)
- Take the Clovis/Huntington Lake exit, Exit 60A, onto CA-168 East. Drive 1.9 miles.
- Take the Shields Ave exit, Exit 2
- Turn left onto E. Shields Ave. Drive 0.4 mile.
- Turn right onto N. Cedar Ave. Drive 0.8 mile.
- 4020 N. Cedar is on the right. Turn right into the Granite Park driveway. Yosemite Falls Cafe is the 2nd building on the left.

From the South:

- Drive north on CA-99 toward Fresno.
