
#### **Bakersfield Meet**


For our next meet in August in the Fresno area bring your Structure Models, and Photographs of Maintenance of Way Rolling Stock. And as always everyone enjoys seeing other models and photos that individuals wish to bring and share with us.

For the remainder of this year the Model Themes will be: November – Diesel Locomotives. The Photo Subjects are: November – Passenger Trains.

The Model Themes for 2014 will be: February – Display/Railroad Scene 1 SQ Ft. (see the note below), May – Caboose, August – Passenger Cars, November – Steam Locomotives. The 2014 Photo subjects will be: February – Track and Rail, May – Bridges, August – Line side, November – Diesel Locomotives.

The Display/Railroad Scene in February 2014 will need to be kept to an approximate size of one square foot (1ft x 1ft, 2ft x 6in, etc). ## 2014 PCR Convention COAST RAILS 2014, TRAINS TO HADLEY JUNCTION

*Come join the fun in San Luis Obispo.* Your 2014 PCR convention will be held April 30-May 4 at the Sands Hotel in beautiful San Luis Obispo. This convention is co-sponsored by the San Luis Obispo Railroad Museum.

San Luis Obispo is rich in Railroad History. The first railroad in the area was the Pacific Coast Railway. Constructed in 1882. A 3-foot gauge railroad that con-



nected Port Hartford (now Avila Beach) with San Luis Obispo, Santa Maria and Los Olivios. The Pacific Coast Railway transported Oil and Agricultural products to Port Hartford to be loaded on steam ships. We will be offering a bus tour of the 'right of way' of this historic railroad.

The Southern Pacific Railroad arrived in San Luis Obispo in 1894 after 5 years of construction to climb over the mountain from Santa Margarita. San Luis Obispo was the main maintenance and crew change point between Los Angeles and San Francisco. The Union Pacific and Amtrak now service the city. We will have tours of the historic railroad district and Amtrak rides over the famous Cuesta Grade.

The San Luis Obispo area is known for its beaches, farmlands, wineries and of course our wonderful Thursday night party know as the Farmers Market. A little to the north but of course on tour is the Hearst Castle.

Karl Hovinitz (our Outside Activities Chair) is putting together a list of many different tours to attract your interest.

Dorothy Deis, my wife, is making sure that there will be plenty for the rest of the family to enjoy whether it is sight seeing, playing golf, shopping, enjoying the many local wineries in some very picturesque surroundings, going to one our beaches, or just sitting back and enjoying the company of others in our hospitality room. You just may want to go on some of the activities yourself.

We will have the normal convention fair also. Our committee is hard at work recruiting Clinicians to educate you, Layout Tours to entertain you and Operations session for your enjoyment.

Robert Chaparro is setting up the layout tours and Rick Anderson putting together the Convention Timetable at will again make sure that you have the proper maps to find them. There will be operating sessions at several of these layouts. All registrants, hosts, and crews for the Convention are eligible to participate in these OPs sessions, with the intention that many who normally do not participate in these structured operating events will take advantage of this opportunity to try it.

## COAST RAILS

No previous experience is necessary, just a desire to run a model railroad as if it were a real transportation system. Again this is open to all. All layout tours and operating sessions are self-guided, with carpooling encouraged.

Of course there will also be contests. Matt Hoffman (Contest Room Manger) is looking for volunteers to help judge and provide security for the contest entries. Speaking of volunteers, Karen Keifer (Volunteer Coordinator) is looking for some people to help us in the following areas: Registration Desk, Clinic Hosts, Contest Room, Contest Judges, Switching Contest, Swap Meet & Non-Rails Hospitality Room.

Registration will start at 9am Wednesday, 30 April The first of the clinics which are being scheduled by Bruce Morden & John Houlihan start at 10:30am Wednesday.

In addition to the normal clinics, we will be offering six Modeling with the Masters Clinics. Special note here: *These clinics are not open clinics. You must buy a ticket and pay a materials fee to attend. You may do so when you register for the convention or, if already registered, go to the "Company Store" page.* Attendance is limited to 18 participants for each clinic so be warned as we expect them to fill up before the convention. Each session lasts 2½ to 5 hours and starts with a workshop, followed by a hands-on session where you will actually build a model aided by Master Model Railroader Clark Kooning. He will assist you, answer your questions and share his modeling expertise, skills and techniques. When the session is finished, you will be able to take your project home.

Another note: Tools are the participant's responsibility. Materials, paints, and adhesives are included in the cost of the clinics and will be provided. Tool lists will be available about six months before the convention. The clinics are **BUILDING A LASER STRUCTURE KIT** in N or HO scale; **SCRATCH BUILDING IN STYRENE** in N, HO, S & O scales; **LEARNING TO BUILD A DPM KIT PROPERLY** in N or HO scale; **BUILDING A TURNOUT USING FAST TRACKS** (24 spaces in this class) and having the opportunity to have it looked over for the NMRA Achievement Program; **SCRATCH BUILD A CATTLE RAMP** in HO scale only; and **SCRATCH BUILD A PUDDLE JUMPER BRIDGE** in HO Scale only.

One change that you should be aware of: Saturday will not be at the Santa Margarita Ranch as the facility can not promise to have its outdoor steam layout in full operation for our convention. Instead we will have the Hobo Breakfast headed up by Rod Smith our Hobo-In-Charge, a swap meet, more clinics and tours including not only a bus tour of the Pacific Coast Railway but you can also visit the recently renovated San Luis Obispo Southern Pacific freight house that is the pride and Joy of the San Luis Obispo Railroad Museum.

Sunday (May 4th) will be the PCR meeting followed by more layouts for you to visit.

#### The GEHAMS GOLDEN EMPIRE HIS-TORICAL & MODELING SOCIETY

The Bakersfield **GEHAMS**, founded in 1987 have been in their current location since March '94. They are a dual-scale model railroading organization.



They boast layouts of 30' x 100' in HO-scale, and 18' x 80' in N-scale. These layouts are based on the Southern Pacific's route from Bakersfield to Mojave with the famous Tehachapi Loop. Though under construction, the mainlines are in with monthly operations.


